ORDER VACATING CERTIFICATE AUTHORIZATION

(Issued September 15, 2005)

1. On May 27, 2005, Gulf South Pipeline Company, LP (Gulf South) filed a motion requesting that the Commission vacate the certificate authorization issued in this docket on March 14, 2003, authorizing Gulf South to uprate its facilities to increase the maximum allowable operating pressure of its Index 135 line in Calcasieu Parish, Louisiana.¹ When Gulf South requested the certificate authorization, it anticipated additional market demand for the transportation of natural gas from the north to the south in the Lake Charles, Louisiana area. Gulf South states that due to changing sources of gas supply, gas is being sourced by customers from the south, not the north. In view of these changed market conditions, Gulf South has decided not to proceed with the construction activities authorized by the March 14 Order. Gulf South's motion is unopposed. Since Gulf South no longer requires the certificate authorization, the Commission will grant Gulf South's motion.

The Commission orders:

The certificate authorization granted on March 14, 2003, in this docket is vacated.
