**NOTICE OF FILING**

Take notice that on July 31, 2007, Midwest Municipal Transmission Group filed a complaint against Interstate Power and Light Company and Midwest Independent Transmission System Operator, Inc., pursuant to Federal Power Act Section 206. The Complaint (at page 1, footnote omitted) states in part:

Midwest Municipal Transmission Group (“MMTG”) hereby files a complaint regarding a stated component of the formula rate used in determining the annual transmission revenue requirement (“ATRR”) of Interstate Power and Light Company (“IPL”), and the resulting rates charged by the Midwest Independent Transmission System Operator, Inc. (“Midwest ISO” or “MISO”) for network transmission service to unbundled transmission customers serving loads located in its “Alliant West” zone. The Complaint ... concerns the return on equity used by IPL for that particular ATRR and zone.

Any person desiring to intervene or to protest this filing should file with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, 888 First Street, NE, Washington, DC 20426, in accordance with Rules 211 and 214 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 CFR 385.211 and 385.214). Protests will be considered by the Commission in determining the appropriate action to be taken, but will not serve to make protestants parties to the proceeding. Any person wishing to become a party must file a motion to intervene. All such motions or protests should be filed on or before the comment date, and, to the extent applicable, must be served on the applicant and on any other person designated on the official service list. This filing is available for review at the Commission or may be viewed on the Commission’s web site at <http://www.ferc.gov>, using the eLibrary link. Enter the docket number excluding the last three digits in the docket number
